THE LORD'S DAY

Many special days have been set aside for God's people in past years. However, Christians have one very special day. The Lord's Day is one that saints honor above all others. John, the apostle, was in the spirit on the Lord's Day (Revelation 1:10). This is the only place in the New Testament where this particular expression is used, but it is obvious what John had in mind. Our Lord was raised from the dead on the first day of the week (Mark 16:2-6). He appeared unto the eleven on the first day of the week (Mark 16:14). The Holy Spirit was poured out upon the apostles and the church was established on the first day of the week (Acts 2). The Christians at Troas assembled, ate the Lord's Supper, and heard the word preached on the first day of the week (Acts 20:7). The Corinthians were exhorted to lay by in store on the first day of the week (1 Corinthians 16:2). From these passages, and others of like nature, it becomes quite plain that the first day of the week is truly the Lord's Day.

The purpose of the Lord's Day worship is twofold. The first is to honor and praise God. God is honored only as we worship as He has instructed. Jesus taught the importance of worshiping God in spirit and in truth (John 4:24). Since the word of God is the only truth concerning worship (John 17:17), we must worship just as the scriptures direct. The second purpose is to build up and strengthen the worshiper. False or incorrect worship will not only keep one from growing stronger, but it will also make one weaker and even cause spiritual

death. Consider the warning given to the Corinthians about eating the Lord's Supper; "For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body. For this cause many are weak and sickly among you, and many sleep" (1 Corinthians 11:29-30). When we learn more about God and how to worship him properly, we will grow stronger spiritually.

There is a growing trend in the Lord's church today to give honor to men that belongs solely unto the Lord. The Lord's Day worship time is being used for special occasions such as honoring graduates, mothers, fathers, policemen, teachers, or any number of other things that are done to the exclusion of scriptural worship. Let us hasten to state that we believe that Christians should, "Render therefore to all their dues: tribute to whom tribute is due; custom to whom custom; fear to whom fear; honour to whom honour" (Romans 13:7). However, we must not use the worship of the Lord's time frame to honor men. We must not ask the Lord to share our worship time to Him with anything or anyone. When we assemble on the Lord's Day, we are to be focused on the One who is to be honored and adored. When our worship is designed to please ourselves or to impress others, it becomes vain, empty, and unacceptable (Matthew 15:9).

We should preach the word of God to teach men and not to be men-pleasers, "For do I now persuade men, or God? or do I seek to please men? for if I yet pleased men, I should not be the servant of Christ" (Galatians 1:10). A well-balanced proclamation of the word is needed more than positive preaching only; "Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and doctrine. For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; And they shall turn away their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables" (2 Timothy 4:2-3). We should sing songs that teach and admonish men and not sing songs to please them. Special singing groups with humming arrangements are not designed to teach and admonish. We should eat the Lord's Supper to remember how and why Christ died. This supper must not be a production aimed at pleasing or impressing men. We should be fervent and sincere as we petition God and give Him thanksgivings. Proper prayers will not include long repetitious prayers designed to impress men. We should "lay by in store" liberally and cheerfully as we have prospered and purposed in our hearts. These contributions are to be used to support the work of each congregation. Elaborate schemes to raise large sums of money may impress men, but they are not approved by God.

Let us always remember that our worship on the first day of the week is unto the Lord in every sense of the word. The first day of the week is a special day set aside for special actions on our part. It is the Lord's Day!

Let us continue to study God's word and apply the lessons that he has taught us.

Christianity is a system of faith, and in that arrangement, the individual who is converted to Christ undergoes a change by his acceptance of the gospel of Christ. God's scheme of salvation is based upon man's response to the truth.
