In presenting his case for Jesus the Messiah, Matthew draws his proof from the Old Testament. There are about 130 direct quotations from or allusions to the Old Testament found in that book of inspiration. The significant thing about this is they are taken from twenty-five of the thirty-nine Old Testament books representing every part of the divisions of the Old Testament (Law, History, Poetry, and Prophecy). Matthew knew his Bible! He was a man of God's Word! The reason that this inspired Gospel account was so saturated with the Word is because Matthew was saturated with the Word of God.

What about us today? Are we saturated with the Word of God? The Psalmist declared, "Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the wicked, Nor standeth in the way of sinners, Nor sitteth in the seat of scoffers: But his delight is in the law of Jehovah; And on his law doth he meditate day and night" (Psalm 1:1-2). To "meditate day and night" is to read God's word by day, and think upon it by night — that is saturation!

"The Treasury of David" says, "He takes a text and carries it with him all day long; and in the night watches, when sleep forsakes his eyelids, he muses upon the Word of God. In the day of his prosperity he sings psalms out of the Word of God, and in the night of his affliction he comforts himself with promises out of the same book."

"HUMANISM"

There is a group of people in our nation who call themselves Humanists. If they are asked the meaning of the word *humanism*, they reply that it is a polite term for *atheism*. These people are not content simply to hold the belief of atheism, but they apparently would like to convert everyone else to that belief. Recently, Humanists have made an effort to force public school officials to remove the expression "one nation under God" from the pledge of allegiance to the flag. They argue this phrase violated the first amendment of the Constitution, which states, "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion or prohibiting the free exercise thereof."

Humanists claim it is unconstitutional to mention the name of God in public schools. If this is true, then teachers cannot read a copy of the Declaration of Independence to their students because this document refers to God five times. According to the Humanists' way of thinking, teachers also cannot read the Gettysburg Address to their students because in that great speech, Lincoln stated, "all men are created equal" and closed with the phrase that "this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom." If Humanists are correct, teachers cannot lead their students in singing "God Bless America" because that wonderful song mentions the name of God three times and is, in fact, a prayer. The lesson we should learn from this is — if these people can go to such great lengths to promote their hopeless beliefs, can Christians with the greatest faith of all and most wonderful hope do any less?
