Where I Stand #1

It is important to realize that the Christian must stand upon the word of God. This must be our guide and standard in all of life for the Christian. "For You are my rock and my fortress; Therefore, for Your name's sake, Lead me and guide me." **Psalms 31:3** There are many today who stand for truth and have proven that fact by standing faithfully on God's Word.

"All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, 17 that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work." **2 Timothy 3:16-17** A simple word study reveals that the word "inspiration" literally means "God breathed". Thus, God breathed out what He wants man to know. The words He has breathed out to man are profitable. These words are not merely opinion or advice they are commands from God. Thus the Bible is not the collections of teachings of men, but is in fact the Word of God. Consider the words of the Apostle Peter when he said "For we did not follow cunningly devised fables..." **2 Peter 2:16a**

Why write about the Bible being from God? There are many today it seems that need to be reminded of this fact. There are those today who are rejecting portions of God's Word and are substituting their own ideas, etc. For that reason we need to be minded that the Bible is just "some old book" but it contains the Word of God that,
