He Restoreth My Soul

"When David was young, as a shepherd boy out in the hills, he was very close to God. God gave him the strength to kill a lion and a bear. God gave him the power to kill Goliath and to free the people of Israel. Then David moved to town and got so busy with other things that he was separated from God to a great degree. He fell into great sin; he needed to be restored. God's prophet, Nathan, called David's sin squarely to his attention by telling him the story of the little ewe lamb. David repented and was thus forgiven. "He restoreth my soul..." (Psa. 23:3a). Only God can restore the souls of men and women. Much like a clock, man's spirit has a way of running down and is then in need of being rewound. As one version of this verse says, "He revives life in me..."

"...He guideth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake" (Psa. 23:3b). Are you aware that a sheep really has no sense of direction? A dog or a cat or a horse, when lost, will find its way home, but not a sheep. Apparently a sheep's eyesight is very limited. He sees only a few yards ahead of him. Sometimes we are more like sheep than we care to admit! When one thinks of all the affairs of life and how easy it is for one to get lost, how wonderful it is to know that "...He guideth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake!" Our Lord guides us by means of the written word. We are, at times, nearsighted and seem to have no real sense of self-direction. Thus our Lord, Who knows the way, serves as our guide. "O Lord, I know that the way of man is not in himself: it is not in man that walketh to direct his steps" (Jere. 10:23). Thank God for Jesus Christ!
