One of your friends remarks to you what a beautiful car you have. You reply that you are indeed proud of the new car, since it cost you approximately \$55,000!

Then, one of your friends turns to you and asks, "Who made this car?" Without so much as a moment's hesitation, you reply, "No one made the car; it just happened." Can you imagine such a scenario? Your friends would have you committed for a mental disorder were you to suggest such a thing. And rightly so. It is obvious to all sane people that the beautiful piece of engineering we call "car" did not "just happen."

The Universe in which you live is infinitely more complex than a car. And yet you are asked every day to believe that it "just happened" by accident.
