INDIFFERENCE By Jesse Dickison

Some people use every excuse under the sun to try to justify their unfaithfulness and indifference. Too many are simply indifferent to the whole cause of Christ. As we study and read about the lives of the apostles, we find in them a dedication to the cause of Christ that they valued even above their own lives and the lives of those they held dear. To them life was Christ and His church. There was nothing greater—there was nothing more wonderful—there was nothing more sacred in their lives than Christ and His church. Consider Paul's exhortation: "Be ye imitators of me, even as I also am of Christ" (1 Cor. 11:1). He wrote, "Faithful is the saying: for if we died with him, we shall also live with him: If we endure, we shall also reign with him: if we shall deny him, he will also deny us: if we are faithless, he abideth faithful; for he cannot deny himself" (2 Tim. 2:11-13).

Yet there are too many folks like Felix in the world today--people who know the truth, realize their need to obey it, but simply put it off (see Acts 24:25). Felix made a fatal mistake: Com mitting oneself to the Lord is not a matter of convenience, but of conviction! That is the differ ence between Felix and the eunuch (see Acts 8:36). The eunuch was convinced and was willing to obey right then. Felix was scared, but he still did not want to be inconvenienced. One who waits for a convenient time to be baptized will never find it. Just as it is never convenient to worship, to study, to help the poor, to teach the lost or anything else the Lord requires of us.

The eunuch asked, "What doth hinder me to be baptized?" (Acts 8:36). The answer for many is simply a lack of faith! Why not have the same spirit of faith the eunuch had? "See, here is water, what doth hinder me to be baptized?"

Friend, you cannot afford to be indifferent to the cause of Christ!
