In a posting on Feb. 28, 2011, it was reported that a man killed his girlfriend's puppy. He has been charged with aggravated cruelty and harassment. He is now in court waiting on this judgment and sentence. In another posting dated April 28, 2011, a 19 year old man was accused of intentionally running over some baby ducks in the parking lot of a fast food restaurant in Ann Arbor, Michigan. He has been charged with killing/torturing animals, which is a four years felony.

While we would never advocate cruelty to animals or try to justify such intentional acts as the two above have been charged with, does anyone else see a bigger problem here? It is not that those who would do such things may have warped minds or little, if any, moral values. Yes, that would be a problem, but look even deeper! Look at what a strange world we live in!

A person intentionally kills a puppy and could go to prison. A person intentionally kills some ducks and could have a felony on his record that will affect him for

years to come. Both of these cases have caused others to be angered and disgusted with those who could possibly commit such acts. Too many people, these young men, if guilty, deserve whatever punishment they get.

Yet, if the stories mentioned were talking about two young ladies who decided to intentionally kill their unborn babies, little, if any, outrage would be raised, and most people would praise their "choice". And, if anyone raised a question about it, the rights of these young ladies to have an abortion would be defended, and those who would oppose such would be portrayed as those who do not care about the lives of these young ladies.

A society that punishes people for killing dogs and ducks, yet legalizes the killing of babies, is certainly a society that has its moral values turned upside down. It is also a society that cares little for God and has failed to understand that God calls the shedding of innocent blood an abomination (Proverbs 6:17).

It is definitely a strange world we live in when animals get more respect than precious babies. It is also a strange world we live in when we shed no tears over these precious souls whose lives are snatched away from them because of parents who care only for themselves!

"Selling Out"

One of the leaders of the early church was Polycarp. He was brought to trial by the authorities and told he must renounce his Christian faith. He replied, "Fourscore and six years have I served Him, and He never did me wrong: how then can I revile my King, my Savior?" They took him out and put him to death. Later when the Christians wrote their history of that period they said, "Polycarp
