Searching For Clues Discovering Truth

- Intro: 1. Solomon was promised wisdom. We can have wisdom today also (1 Kings 3:9)
 - 2. He didn't want a long life, the life of his enemies or even riches, but only
 - 3. Wisdom and understanding (1 Kings 3:11-12)
 - 1. Unlocking the Mysteries
 - A. Riddles
 - i. Riddles are things the minds of men simply cannot understand without wisdom provided by God's Word (**Pro 1:6**).
 - ii. The Bible is simple but not for those who are too lazy to study and learn to understand it's message (2 Tim 2:15)
 - B. The Bible can be understood.
 - 1. The more we read & study the more we will understand (2 Tim 2:15).
 - 2. The treasures of wisdom from God can be discovered & retained
 - (**Pro 2:1**). If we choose to make God's Word a priority we will retain what we read and learn.
 - 3. We CAN understand the Bible, if we truly desire to do so.
 - II. A Wise Person Knows...
 - A. A wise person knows the Value of God's Truth (**Pro 13:7**)
 - 1. How can a rich person still be poor (Mt 16:26, Mk 10:22)? Their love of wealth kept them from spiritual knowledge.
 - 2. It's foolish not to include God in our plans. Notice the "I's" in Luke 12:16-21.
 - B. A Wise Person will welcome Instruction

(Pro 9:8-9; 14:6; 15:5; 18:2)

1. A wise person will "listen & learn". Only a fool rejects sound advice — not just advice but sound advice (**Pro 18:2**).

2. To reject wisdom from others who are trying to help is foolish (**Pro 12:6, 14:16-17**).

C. A Wise Person will accept advice

- 1. A Wise person will accept advice & apply it-meaning actually take the advice and do whatever advice is given.
- 2. How many times have we heard the advice think before you speak (Col 4:6)? Do we always take that advice?

D. A Wise Person will flee from Evil (**Pro 4:14-19**)

- 1. A wise person will not play with fire (sin). They will flee from it (**Pro 4:14-15**).
- 2. The only wise way to defeat Satan and Sin is ... (James 4:7, Eph 5:1).

E. A Wise Person will find pleasure in Righteousness (**Pro 10:23; 14:9; 15:21**)

- 1. Some delight in sin and the sins others commit, they actually approve and/or promote sin (**Rom 1:22**).
- 2. We should rejoice in righteousness & truth not sin (1 Cor 13:6).
- 3. We should rejoice in truth AND we (Christians) should find no pleasure in unrighteousness (Jn 17:17; 6:32).

Conc:

- 1. The book of proverbs has a purpose to impart wisdom to all (**Pro 1:2-6**).
- 2. Are you gaining from its wisdom? From Solomon's wisdom, from God's wisdom?
